

Programs Funded from April 1, 2018 to March 31, 2019

The following is an overview of CHF funded agencies that all work in partnership under Calgary's Homeless Serving System of Care.

## Abbreviations & Definitions:

**F:** Federally Funded

**P:** Provincially Funded

**AH:** Alberta Health Funded

**D:** Funded Through Donations

**SH:** Supportive Housing - Case management and housing supports to individuals and families who are considered moderate to high acuity.

**PSH:** Permanent Supportive Housing - Long term housing for people experiencing homelessness with deep disabilities (including cognitive disabilities) without a length of stay time limit.

**Acuity** - An assessment of the level of complexity of a person's experience. Higher acuity typically relates to higher complexity.

**ACM:** Adaptive Case Management - The services provided to the client are adapted to the needs of the client at any given time in the program. It is intended for lower acuity clients who can live independently after a time limited intervention.

**Chronic Homeless** - Those who have either been continuously homeless for a year or more, or have had at least four episodes of homelessness in the past three years.

**Episodic Homeless** - A person who is homeless for less than a year and has fewer than four episodes of homelessness in the past three years.

**Placed Based Housing** - A purpose built or designated affordable housing unit/complex. Typically used for PSH programs.

**Scattered-Site Housing** - Individual housing units scattered throughout the city.

<b>Accessible Housing Society</b>	Newbridge	P	This program provides housing first specialized Permanent Supportive Housing (PSH) in a fully accessible place based environment for men experiencing homelessness and who also have mobility impairments.
<b>Alexandra Community Health Centre (The ALEX)</b>	Abbeydale	P	This program provides housing first specialized PSH in a place based health focused environment for adults experiencing chronic homelessness and who also have significant mental health, health and addictions challenges.
<b>Alexandra Community Health Centre (The ALEX)</b>	Homebase	F,P	This program provides housing first SH supports for chronically and episodically homeless adults in a scattered site model.
<b>Alexandra Community Health Centre (The ALEX)</b>	Pathways to Housing	AH	This medically specialized program provides housing first Assertive Community Treatment (ACT) supports through a team of professionals to chronically homeless individuals in a scattered site model. This focus is on clients with brain disorders leaving hospitals and corrections and those with a history of emergency shelter use.
<b>Alexandra Community Health Centre (The ALEX)</b>	Prelude	P	This program provides housing first specialized PSH in a harm reduction focused place based environment for high acuity adults experiencing chronic homelessness.
<b>Alpha House Society</b>	Alpha Housing Program	P	This program provides housing first SH with case management to chronically and episodically homeless individuals with an active addiction in a scattered site model designed to promote community integration.
<b>Alpha House Society</b>	Aurora on the Park	P	This program provides housing first specialized PSH in a fully accessible, harm reduction focused place based environment for chronic high acuity adults experiencing homelessness and who also have mobility impairments and addictions challenges.
<b>Alpha House Society</b>	Downtown Outreach Addiction Partnership (DOAP team)	P	This program provides 24/7 crisis response and outreach to ensure that individuals staying outside can survive and to reduce interactions with emergency services such as police and ambulance.
<b>Alpha House Society</b>	Francis Manor	P	This program provides housing first PSH in a harm reduction focused place based environment for high acuity adults experiencing chronic homelessness.
<b>Alpha House Society</b>	Sunalta Lodge	P	This program provides housing first PSH in a harm reduction focused place based environment for high acuity adults experiencing chronic homelessness.
<b>Alpha House Society</b>	Veterans Housing Program	F	This program provides housing first PSH in a harm reduction focused place based environment for high acuity veterans experiencing chronic or episodic homelessness.

<b>Alpha House Society</b>	Women's Housing Program	P	This program provides housing first specialized PSH in a harm reduction focused place based environment for high acuity adult women experiencing chronic homelessness.
<b>Aspen Family and Community Network Society</b>	Homestay	P	This Prevention program is for families at imminent risk of homelessness. The goal is to maintain the families' existing housing by providing short-term case management and supports, as needed.
<b>Aspen Family and Community Network Society</b>	Sustainable Families	P	This program provides housing first SH supports for chronically and episodically homeless families in a scattered site model.
<b>Aspen Family and Community Network Society</b>	ACM	P	This program offers ACM supports for families who are experiencing homelessness.
<b>Boys and Girls Clubs of Calgary</b>	828-HOPE	P	The program works to provide an immediate response and case management to prevent homelessness for youth at risk of losing their housing, reducing the period of homelessness for youth who are already on the street, and ensuring that youth are connected with the social supports that will help them remain housed. This is an extension to 828-HOPE, a centralized referral and assessment line for youth, families, and professionals to call for access to resources and support for vulnerable youth.

<b>Boys and Girls Clubs of Calgary</b>	Homefire	F,P	This program offers housing first SH supports for Indigenous youth who are experiencing homelessness.
<b>Boys and Girls Clubs of Calgary</b>	Infinity	F,P	This program offers SH supports for youth who are experiencing homelessness.
<b>Calgary Alternative Support Services</b>	Langin Place	P	This housing first program provides PSH in a harm reduction focused place based environment for chronic high acuity adults experiencing homelessness.
<b>Calgary Alternative Support Services (CASS)</b>	Stepping Stone Manor	P	This housing first program provides PSH in a harm reduction focused place based environment for high acuity adults experiencing chronic homelessness.
<b>Children's Cottage Society</b>	Homebridge	P	The program primary purpose is to support families to stay in their own home. This will be done by providing a comprehensive range of services that will allow us to move far upstream, ideally intervening long before a family becomes homeless.

<b>Children's Cottage Society</b>	ACM	P	This program offers ACM supports for families who are experiencing homelessness.
<b>Children's Cottage Society</b>	Rapid Rehousing	P	The program offers Rapid Rehousing services to homeless families, including case management, housing location, counselling and supports.
<b>Calgary John Howard Society</b>	Adult Housing Reintegration Program	P	This program provides specialized housing first SH supports for chronically and episodically homeless adults who have had frequent interactions with the justice system, in a scattered site model.
<b>Calgary John Howard Society</b>	Roofs for Youth	F	This program provides SH supports for youth (15 to 24) in either scattered site, or group living situations.
<b>Closer to Home Community Services</b>	ACM	P	This program offers ACM supports for families who are experiencing homelessness.
<b>CUPS</b>	Community Development	P	This program provides affordable housing to clients in multiple placed based settings for chronically or episodically low acuity homeless adults. The program specializes on developing a sense of community within each apartment.
<b>CUPS</b>	Graduate Housing Program	P	This program provides a rental subsidy and limited supports to clients who have completed a Housing First program and who no longer require case management support.
<b>CUPS</b>	Graduate Rent Subsidy Program	P	This program provides a rental subsidy to clients who have completed a Housing First program and who no longer require case management support.
<b>CUPS</b>	Key Case Management	P	This program provides housing first SH supports for chronically and episodically homeless adults in a scattered site model.
<b>CUPS</b>	ACM	P	This program offers ACM supports for families who are experiencing homelessness.
<b>Discovery House Family Violence Prevention Society</b>	Community Housing Program	P	This program offers SH supports for women and children who are experiencing homelessness and domestic violence.
<b>Discovery House Family Violence Prevention Society</b>	ACM	P	This program offers ACM supports for families experiencing homelessness.

<b>Distress Centre Calgary</b>	Coordinated Access and Assessment (CAA)	F,P	The Distress Centre oversees the assessment portion of the Coordinated Access and Assessment process, by completing screening and referrals to the system of care.
<b>Calgary Dream Centre</b>	Living in Community	P	This program provides SH supports to chronically and episodically homeless individuals who want to address their addiction challenges in a sober based scattered site model designed to promote community integration.
<b>HomeSpace Society</b>	Bridgeland Ophelia Supportive Housing (BOSH)	P	This program provides specialized PSH to chronically and episodically homeless individuals who require mental health supports in partnership with Alberta Health Services.
<b>Inn From The Cold Society</b>	Housing with Intensive Supports	P	This program offers SH supports for families who are experiencing homelessness.
<b>Inn From The Cold Society</b>	Journey House 1	P	This program provides SH supports in a place based environment to single mothers with young children who are experiencing homelessness.
<b>Inn From The Cold Society</b>	Journey House 2	P	This program provides SH supports in a place based environment to families with multiple children who are experiencing homelessness.
<b>Calgary Keys to Recovery Society</b>	ASCHH and Indigenous Community Liaison	F,P	This program supports Indigenous peoples experiencing homelessness, as well as other economic, social and health issues through the Aboriginal Standing Committee on Housing and Homelessness (ASCHH). The Community Liaison supports the Committee's mission and priorities.
<b>Calgary Keys to Recovery Society</b>	Creation Lodge	F	This program supports the development of a "Creation Lodge", which provides access to urban Indigenous and vulnerable populations to foundational teachings of cultural creation stories related through Elders and Indigenous Knowledge Keepers.
<b>Calgary Keys to Recovery Society</b>	Keys to Recovery	P	This program provides SH supports to chronically and episodically homeless individuals who want to address their addiction challenges in a sober based scattered site model.

<b>Wood's Homes</b>	Exit Reach	P	This program is intended to enhance and build capacity in mental health supports for homeless youth (13-24) engaged with the CAA.
<b>Wood's Homes</b>	New Horizon	P	This program offers SH supports for youth (18-24) who are experiencing homelessness.
<b>YW Calgary</b>	Community Housing Program - Croydon	P	This program provides housing first PSH in a place based environment for adult women experiencing chronic homelessness.
<b>YW Calgary</b>	Community Housing Program - Providence	P	This program provides housing first PSH in a place based environment for adult women experiencing chronic homelessness.
